



The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRC) is a not-for-profit corporation established by agreement between the Grand Council Chief of the Anishinabek Nation and the Ontario Minister of Natural Resources to further the knowledge and conservation of fisheries resources of interest to member First Nations and Ontario's stakeholders.

The A/OFRC is seeking a Senior Fisheries Biologist with demonstrated field experience. The successful candidate will be responsible for collaborating with management, intermediate, and junior professional staff in the preparation of the annual field program, and overseeing fisheries data collection in a supervisory/quality assurance role, while providing leadership to other staff. The successful applicant will also utilize their experience in providing project design and advanced data analysis. The candidate's excellent writing skills will be used to create funding proposals, quality technical reports and correspondence. This full-time position will be based out of the Centre's main office in North Bay, Ontario, however extensive travel to First Nation communities in the Lake Superior Region (Michipicoten to Thunder Bay, including the Lake Nipigon area) may be required.

Salary Range:

Qualifications:

- Graduation from a university of recognized standing with degree in fisheries science or related discipline
- Minimum of 10 years demonstrated experience in freshwater fisheries project design and, analyzing and presenting fisheries assessment/fish population data
- Project and Personnel Management Skills: ability to manage field program, projects co-ordination, preparing or evaluating technical proposals, supervise field crews
- Good organizational skills and, proficiency with Microsoft Office and statistical applications
- Very strong communication (written and oral), client relationship building and presentation skills
- Experience working with First Nation communities and/or other communities
- Supervisory experience
- Familiarity with GIS
- Willingness to travel on a regular basis
- Valid Ontario driver's licence
