



The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRC) is a not-for-profit corporation established by agreement between the Grand Chief of the Anishinabek Nation and the Ontario Minister of Natural Resources to further the knowledge and conservation of fisheries resources of interest to member First Nations and Ontario's stakeholders.

The A/OFRC is seeking a senior fisheries biologist with demonstrated field experience. The successful candidate will be responsible for overseeing fisheries data collection in a supervisory/quality assurance role, providing leadership to junior staff. The successful applicant will also utilize their experience in providing project design and advanced data analysis. Excellent writing skills will be used to create quality technical reports and correspondence. This full-time position will be based out of the Centre's main office in North Bay, Ontario, however duties will be focused on First Nation communities in the Lake Superior Region (Michipicoten to Thunder Bay, including the Lake Nipigon area). The position will involve extensive travel.

Qualifications:

- Graduation from a university of recognized standing with degree in fisheries science or related discipline
- Minimum of 10 years demonstrated experience in field project design and, analyzing and presenting fisheries assessment and fish population data

- Experience working with First Nation communities and/or other communities
- Willingness to travel for extended periods of time
- Valid Ontario driver's licence
