



**1 Position: Contract Fisheries Technician  
(Contract, Full-time)**

The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRC) is a not-for-profit corporation established by agreement between the Grand Council Chief of the Anishinabek Nation and the Ontario Minister of Natural Resources to further the knowledge and conservation of fisheries resources of interest to member First Nations and Ontario's stakeholders.

The A/OFRC is offering a unique contract job opportunity to a fisheries technician with demonstrated field experience. The successful candidate will be a member of field crews, be responsible for overseeing fisheries data collection in the field in a supervisory/quality assurance role, archiving, analyzing and reporting fisheries data, have off-season support functions related to the maintenance and care of equipment, and facilities and acting as a resource in A/OFRC symposia and educational workshops. This full-time position will be based out of the Centre's main office in North Bay, Ontario but will involve travel throughout the Lake Superior and Lake Huron regions and Southern Ontario.

The A/OFRC places the highest priority on safety in the workplace. During the current pandemic we have modified work practices to ensure the safety of our staff and members of the communities who may be in contact with them.

The position is open immediately and will remain open until a suitable candidate is selected.

**Remuneration:** \$25.64-\$30.77/hr. based on a 37.5 hour work week

**The ideal candidate will have:**

- Graduation from a college or university of recognized standing with diploma/degree in a natural resource oriented field
- Experience completing fisheries assessment projects, preferably including supervisory roles
- Proven leadership and organizational skills
- Knowledge of or desire to learn about Anishinabek culture
- Valid Ontario driver's license
- Possession of Small Vessel Operator Proficiency and Marine Emergency Duties A3 certificates would be an asset
- Demonstrated report writing skills would be an asset

*Given the traditional practices of the Anishinabek, exposure to wood smoke and the burning of sacred medicines, including tobacco, sweet grass, sage or cedar, may occur within the work setting.*
