Lake Sturgeon Movement Study

Location: Garden River First Nation

The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRC), in partnership with Garden River First Nation will be conducting a Lake Sturgeon movement study in May & September of 2023. This is an ongoing project and will be conducted yearly.

The A/OFRC will be deploying telemetry receivers in the Garden River, St. Mary's River and Lake George. The receivers are capable of collecting movement information from sturgeon that have been implanted with an acoustic tag. All information gathered will be shared with Garden River First Nation and used to analyze Lake Sturgeon movement in the area.
