NIPISSING FIRST NATION SHORELINE ASSESSMENT

The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Center (A/OFRC) in partnership with Nipissing First Nation, will be conducting a fish habitat and impact assessment along the Lake Nipissing shoreline.

What: A shoreline survey that will document natural (the littoral zone, slope of the shoreline, fish habitat, erosion) and man-made (shoreline developments) features.

Where: Along residential areas (Garden Village, Jocko Point, Yellek).

When: Throughout the month of August.

Why: These data will be compared to a 2012 A/OFRC shoreline study to determine if there have been major changes to the shoreline along Lake Nipissing and its potential impacts on the fish community.
