## ALDERVILLE FIRST NATION

### Sandercock Creek Assessment

Alderville First Nation, in partnership with the Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRFC), will conduct a detailed stream assessment in summer 2026 using the Ontario Stream Assessment Protocol (OSAP).

A/OFRFC staff will carry out fieldwork on Alderville First Nation lands along Sandercock Creek over a period of up to one week. The assessment will include sampling of the fish community, stream flow, channel morphology, riparian vegetation, and other key ecological features.

The information collected will provide Alderville First Nation with a comprehensive understanding of the current condition of Sandercock Creek. This will support informed decision-making related to responsible development and help identify and protect significant ecological features.
