GARDEN RIVER FIRST NATION

Garden River and St Mary's River Nme (Lake Sturgeon) Telemetry

The Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Centre (A/OFRFC), in partnership with the Garden River First Nation Lands and Resources Department and Guardians Unit, will be conducting a Lake Sturgeon movement study on the Garden River and St Mary's River. This is an ongoing project and will be conducted yearly during the spring and fall.

The A/OFRFC will be deploying seasonal telemetry receivers in the Garden River, and deep-set receivers in the St. Mary's River and Lake George. The receivers can collect movement information from sturgeon that have been implanted with an acoustic tag. All information gathered will be shared with Garden River First Nation and used to analyze Lake Sturgeon movement in the area.

Please do not remove the receivers from the water or their anchors.
