### MOOSE DEER POINT FIRST NATION

## Stream Assessment



Moose Deer Point First Nation in partnership with the Anishinabek/Ontario Fisheries Resource Center (A/OFRFC) will be completing a detailed stream assessment during the summer of 2026, following Ontario Stream Assessment Protocol (OSAP).

A/OFRFC staff will be working on Moose Deer Point First Nation Land, on an un-named creek flowing into King Bay for up to a week sampling the creek for fish community assemblage, flow, morphology, riparian vegetation, and other ecological features.

The information collected from this project will provide Moose Deer Point First Nation with a detailed account of the status of the creek, which can be used to inform responsible development and identify any significant ecological features.
